

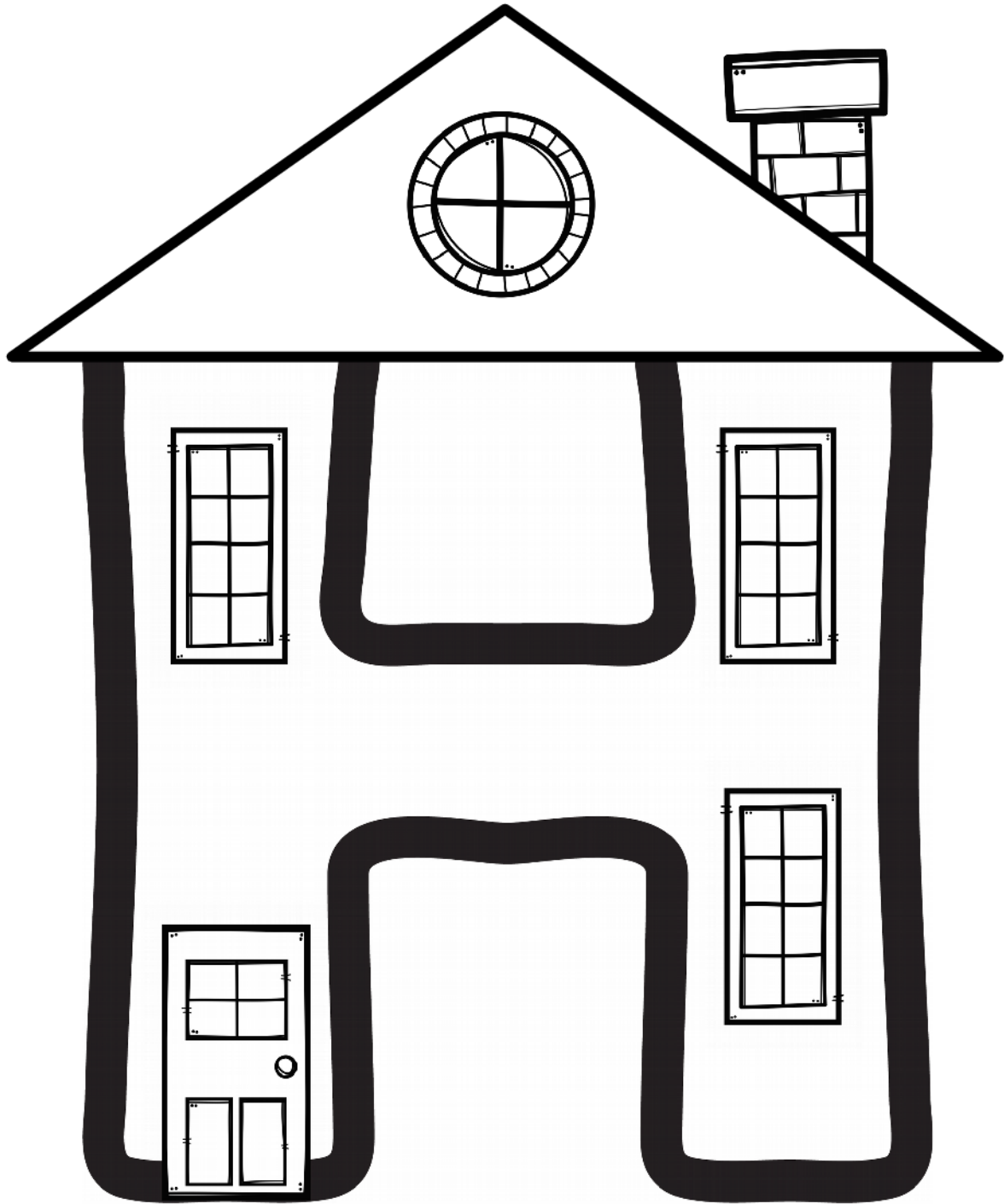
What You Get

This packet contains materials for the letter H.

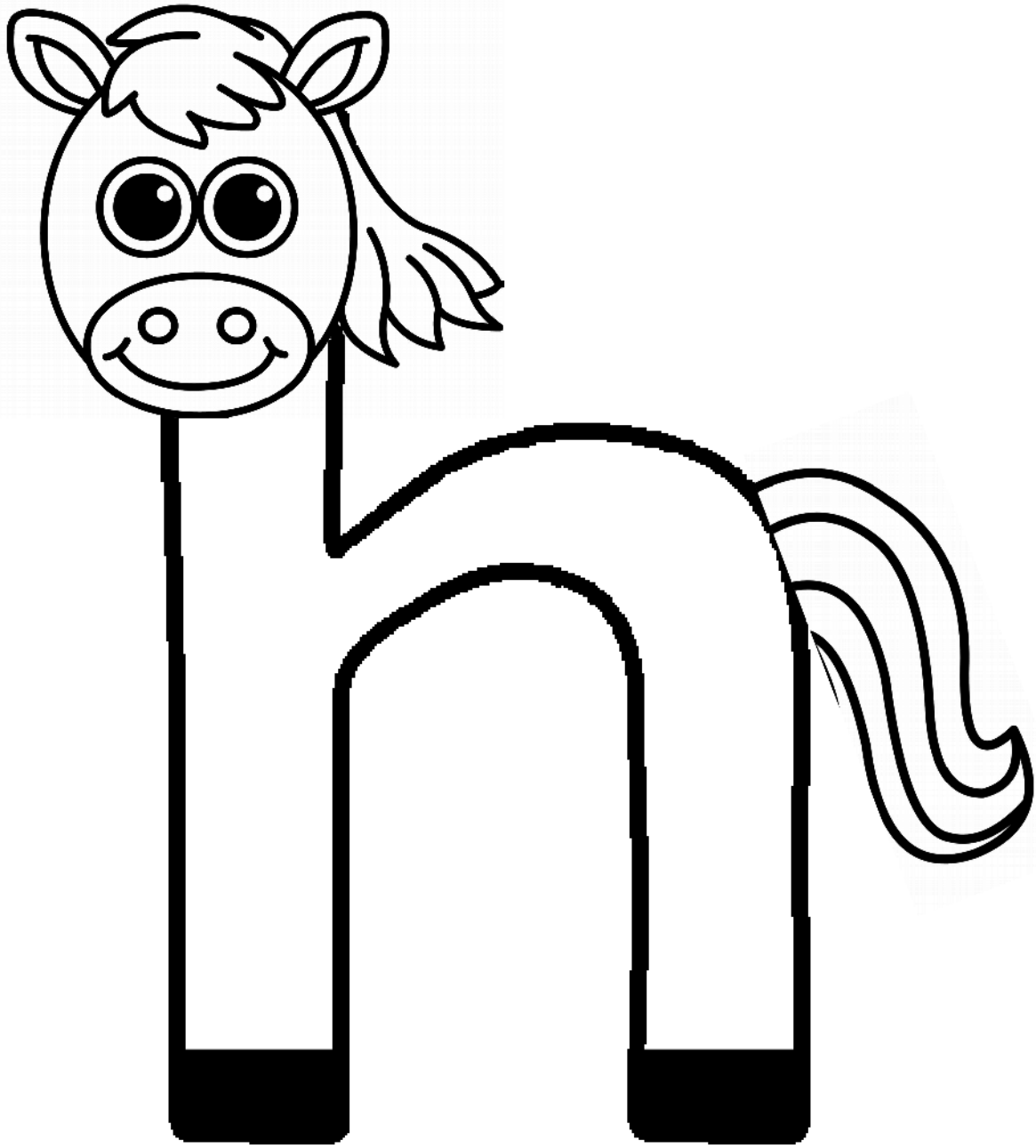
This print and go letter packet consists of a wide variety of activities that are great for learning the letters of the alphabet. All 40 pages are print and go or no prep needed activities.

- Alphabet Pages (pages 3-4) – These were mostly designed to show students how to use the pieces from the build your letter project, but they can also be used for coloring pages (and even turned into posters!)
- Build Your Letters (pages 5-6) – You will get an uppercase letter and a lowercase letter to build out into something that starts with the letter.
- Coloring Pages (pages 7-9) – You get a coloring page that features both the uppercase and the lowercase letter, one that features only the uppercase letter, and one that features only the lowercase letter.
- Do-a-Dot Letters (pages 10-11) – You get one page for uppercase letters and one page for lowercase letters. Each page is designed for use with do-a-dot markers (though they can also be used with coloring tools, stickers, and so much more!).
- Do-a-Dot Reveal (pages 12-13) – You get one page for uppercase letters and one page for lowercase letters. Students mark the letter to reveal an image. In this case the image will be either the uppercase or lowercase letter. These too were designed for use with do-a-dot markers, but can be used in many different ways.
- Find the Letter (pages 14-15) – You get two different find the letter pages. In both cases these can be used with a variety of tools, but kids really like to use highlighters with them!
- Find the Letter in the Words (page 16) – This page provides a variety of words and students find the letter inside the words. They are designed with circles and can be used with do-a-dot markers (or even highlighters!).
- Letter Tracing (pages 17-19) – You will get an uppercase and lowercase letter tracing page (with both), an uppercase only page, and a lowercase only page. These pages are designed for beginning writers who aren't ready to write the letters on their own yet.

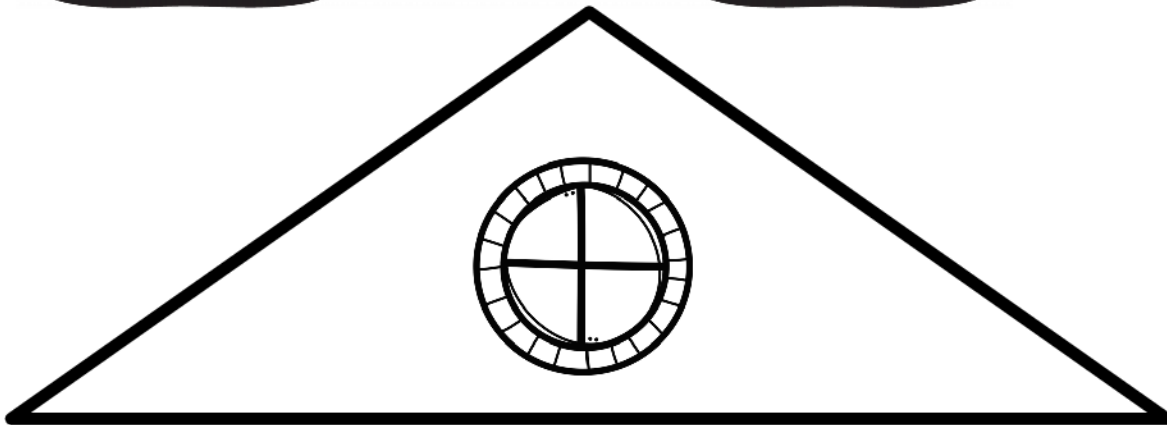
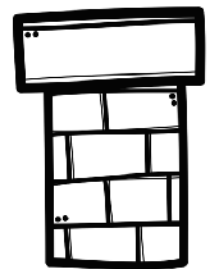
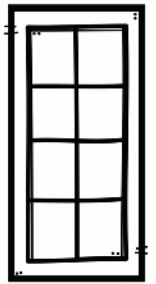
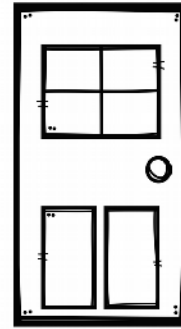
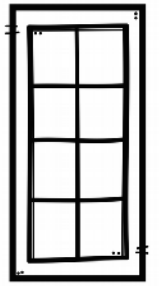
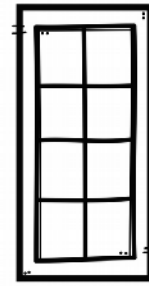
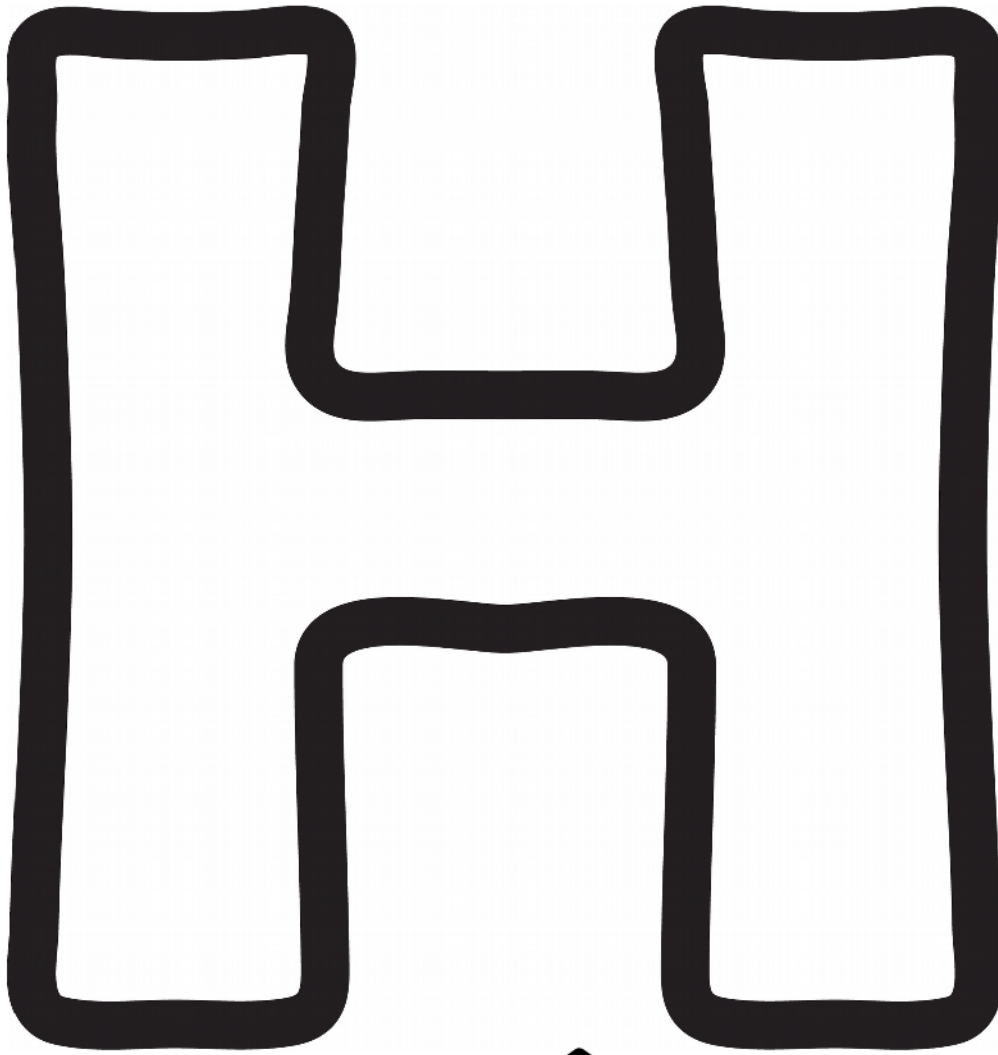
- Write the Letter (pages 20-21) – For students who are ready for letter writing you get two pages for that. Each page has a different design and features both the uppercase and the lowercase letters.
 - Letter Mazes (pages 22-24) – These letter mazes are designed to follow the letters through a grid of circles. You will get a mixed case one, an uppercase one, and a lowercase one. They are designed with circles for use with do a dot markers for those that wish to use do-a-dot markers. You can also use them with highlighters.
 - Mark the Pictures (page 25) – This page features images that are related to the letter (most begin with the letter with the exception of x). Students mark or color the images with uppercase letters one color and lowercase letters a second color. The word mark is used so you can use it as a color-by-letter or you can have students circle the images, cross them out, or even mark them with do-a-dot markers.
 - Punch Cards (page 26) – You will get a punch card for the uppercase letters and one for the lowercase letters. You also get 2 punch cards for beginning sounds. You will cut them out. They were designed for use with a hole punch, but would also be fun with a highlighter.
 - Letter Sorting (pages 27-28) – This activity takes up two pages. One is a cool sorting mat for separating out uppercase and lowercase letters and one contains the letters to be sorted.
 - Phonics Sorting (pages 29-30) – In a similar fashion to letter sorting you will get a worksheet sorting mat and images to cut out and glue on the sorting mat.
 - Color by Letter (pages 31-32) – These are images where students color based on uppercase and lowercase letters.
 - Color the Phonics (page 33) – This page has students coloring the images that start with the letter. With the exception of x which includes images that end with the letter as well as begin with the letter.
 - Alphabet Tracing (page 34) – This worksheet includes tracing alphabet images.
 - Q-Tip Painting (page 35) – This fun activity has students use a q-tip (cotton swab) to paint the dots on the page.
 - Letter Maze (page 36) – This letter shaped maze has students follow the letter through the maze.
 - Dot-to-Dot (pages 37-39) There are 3 dot-to-dot worksheets. One has an uppercase letter, one a lowercase letter, and then an image that starts with the letter.
 - Letter Word Practice (pages 40-41) – These pages have students practice words that start with the letter.
 - Alphabet Sentences Color and Trace (page 42) – These sentences are based on the alphabet. Students color the sentence and then trace it for great practice.
- These 22 activities provide a huge variety of ways to practice the alphabet making letter of the week fun!**
